River Folk Festival 2019 musical magic for everyone

ith more than 30 acts and 80 plus hours of programming across five Warburton venues, the second annual River Folk Festival from the 15 to 17 March 2019 will be a celebration of our local talent, and an opportunity to see national and international artists right here in our home town - including celebrated international performers Scott Cook and Dana Sipos from Canada, and internationally acclaimed Michigan folk duo, Red Tail Ring.

Venues include the Warburton Arts Centre with wonderful spaces for bigger crowds and high energy music, and St Mary's Church, a perfect location for smaller intimate gatherings. Outdoor spaces will be activated with two pop-up venues, one on the village green and one by the river at BT Dubs.

One of the organisers Sam Watson says, 'Through the River Folk Festival, we aim to develop, strengthen and promote the cultural identity of our local community as a vibrant cultural hub. The festival is a community led, community developed festival that holds the highest ethical, environmental sustainability and cultural inclusivity standards.'

Behind the scenes the festival is also providing new opportunities for local youth to gain valuable hands-on experience in high end quality programming and event management. The team of festival volunteers develop new friendships and ties across the community that are forged in the joy of sharing in the creative development process.

'People genuinely feel they are part of the festival and value that we don't compromise on quality, so they can't wait to come back. We involve our community at every level so there is a sense of ownership. Having an event like this in town is good for everyone - artists, support people, businesses, young people, locals and visitors alike. There's so much talent here in the valley.'

River Folk Festival has its heart in the centre of the community and is a celebration of collaboration, great music and a great town. It's a festival everyone can enjoy. Let the music flow!

Looking back, looking forward —

seed funding breeds success

ast September, Warburton Community Space (WCS) quietly celebrated five years of operation. A recipient of Sponsorship funding from the Community Bank® in 2013, the WCS was established on Thomas Ave as a 'go-to' place for the community that was affordable, accessible and welcoming. Over the five years it has hosted more than 60 different community groups, often for only a gold coin donation, and become a much loved part of the Warburton township. Every Monday, a 'pay-what-you-can-afford' lunch is offered, and many other activities occur during the week/month including Friday art group, Open Mic, ReMakery and the Warburton Summer Produce Market. Several small local businesses have been able to make a start through hiring the commercial kitchen and the outdoor area is the home of a free book exchange and place to seed swap and share produce.

The WCS has evolved to meet the changing needs of the community and has often had to have creative responses to the challenges of keeping the 'Space' sustainable. With seed funding allowing the initial lease of the premises, the ongoing expenses of operation have been met through fundraising, space hire and donations. Warburton's Big Day Out was a great community event with proceeds going to WCS, and local businesses have also been supportive. So what is the key to longevity for community groups and initiatives such as this?

Committee members say it hasn't always been easy, and being proactive and establishing strong ties in the community has been vital. 'You need to be able to ask for help, know where to seek grant

funding and write applications!' says the committee. While there have been ups and downs, the WCS is excited for the future and grateful for the community's ongoing support.
