Yarra Valley Friendship Group

- Yarra Junction

This group will provide a weekly meeting point in Yarra Junction for isolated older people in the Upper Yarra Valley who may be experiencing loneliness, depression and mental illness, providing support, companionship and helping them enjoy life again.



Toy Library – *Yarra Junction*

In a much needed upgrade of equipment and modernisation of systems, the Toy Library will purchase specialised sensory toys supporting children with special needs, and a diverse and appealing range of quality educational toys and equipment for new families moving into the area. This is the only toy library of its type in the area.



Wesburn Junior Football Club – Wesburn

This club provides players with skills and a strong team network, building healthy

children who feel supported and strive for success with mentoring from the coaches. With a strong community approach, the club uses funding to subsidise memberships fees and uniforms to help families who may struggle to stay engaged and participate fully.

Upper Yarra Body Image Group – Upper Yarra

'Weight Paradigms of Health' seminar will introduce community members, policy makers and health advocates to the importance of 'weight inclusive' actions that focus on self-care, health enhancing behaviours and celebrate body diversity – an important topic for the Yarra Valley where admissions to hospital for eating disorders are 30% above the state average. The seminar will be held in September.

An 8-week therapeutic after-school program that supports children to increase their ability to understand and manage 'big feelings', self-esteem and relationships through arts/craft, games and a supportive group environment. This program will foster engagement with CIRE Community House as a safe place and fill a much needed gap for therapeutic groups for primary school children in the Upper Yarra.

Examples of programs that are being supported by this Collaborative Marketing initiative include:

Outer East Food Share work with emergency food relief agencies to get better produce to their clients – families in need. Funding for a reliable 'chill zone' vehicle means fresh and frozen foods can be easily transported from suppliers to Warburton bringing greater variety more often, while reducing the amount of food going to landfill.

Holy Holy Fools is a not-for-profit charitable Fools organisation working to support and prevent Inc homelessness in the Yarra Ranges. Funding was used to develop an informative flyer about services and options available to those at risk of homelessness that is distributed through rental and real estate agencies and ensures people are able to take practical action to address difficulties and seek the right support services.

Days for Girls is a community organisation that makes more than 1000 sanitary packs per year for distribution to young girls in six developing nations. Funding was used to buy fabric and equipment. These packs help remove barriers for attending school, and provide a sense of dignity and self-agency for young women across the world.

Animal Aid is a not-for-profit organisation devoted to animal welfare looking after more than 6000 unwanted and surrendered cats, dogs and livestock per year, and helping reunite and rehome lost and abandoned animals. Funding was used to provide an After Hours Contained Animal Collection service in the Yarra Ranges.

RAPA – Ranges Academy of Performing Arts is supporting kids 8-18 years of age with the opportunity to work creatively in drama, dance and filmmaking to developing their own unique vision and works. It includes the Film in Schools program at 10 local schools.

We never take our focus away from the community that is closest to our heart, where our customers live, but the opportunity to expand our viewpoint and bring community services and ideas in closer to our towns is a great way to grow new talents and resources.

Engage with these organisations and activities – they are part of our 'bigger than a bank' community! And, of course, this investment is over and above our local Sponsorship program, so everyone wins!
